COVID-19 Advice for Leaders

Before KYCK:

Have a process for youth and leaders to declare that:

- They are currently free of symptoms of COVID-19.
- They have not been diagnosed as a COVID-19 case in the previous 5 days.
- They are not awaiting a PCR test result for COVID-19.
- They will notify their group leader if they develop symptoms of COVID-19 while at KYCK.

Where possible, encourage leaders and youth to conduct a RAT (Rapid Antigen Test) the day you leave for KYCK. This is not a requirement to attend but helps minimize risk.

Encourage all leaders and youth to be up to date with vaccinations and boosters they are eligible for.

It is recommended, but not mandatory, to wear masks where appropriate social distancing with other groups is not possible.

During KYCK

Please follow the directions provided by KYCK.

We are implementing the following measures at KYCK to minimise the risk of virus transmission:

- Increased ventilation in our auditorium.
- Encouraging social distancing wherever possible.
- Increased hand washing and hand sanitisation stations.
- Increased venue cleaning including pre-event, during and post event cleaning by hygiene officers with particular emphasis on high touch points.

- Providing an option to pre-order merchandise items for collection each weekend to minimise queuing. For further information visit kyck.org.au/merch
- Our first aid provider for the weekend, Event Safety Services, will be onsite and have protocols to follow for all situations.
- There will be areas specifically for isolation in our outdoor plaza, if required.

Response to Possible COVID-19 Case

Implement the following guidelines in the event of a possible COVID-19 case.

A) A person with symptoms

If a leader or youth develops symptoms of COVID-19 at KYCK:

1. They must be isolated immediately until they can be picked up from KYCK by a parent, guardian, or other suitable person.
2. They must be tested for COVID-19 (which we strongly recommend be conducted at a testing clinic)* and isolate at accommodation while waiting for results. Katoomba Christian Convention staff must be notified ASAP with the test results.
 - › If the result is positive, they must remain in isolation at your accommodation.
 - › If the result is negative, they may return to KYCK once symptoms clear.
3. The group of the person with symptoms are to be monitored for COVID-19 symptoms while waiting for results. If a positive result is returned (PCR or RAT), follow the procedure for close contacts below.

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B) Close contacts

A person who has been in a close group setting (i.e. room group members) with someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 is a close contact.

1. They must be tested for COVID-19 (which we strongly recommend be conducted at a testing clinic)* and isolate while waiting for results. Katoomba Christian Convention staff must be notified ASAP with the test results.
 - › If the result is positive, they must remain in isolation at your accommodation.
 - › If the result of the test is negative close contacts must follow NSW Health household and close contact guidelines.**

* It is strongly recommended that COVID-19 testing is undertaken at a testing clinic. However, if your group has Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kits then you could use them to test a person with symptoms to obtain immediate results for faster

identification of close contacts to reduce risk of spread.

** Please note that current guidelines recommend avoiding large or crowded indoor gatherings where possible and you must wear a mask when you are in an indoor setting that is not your own home.
